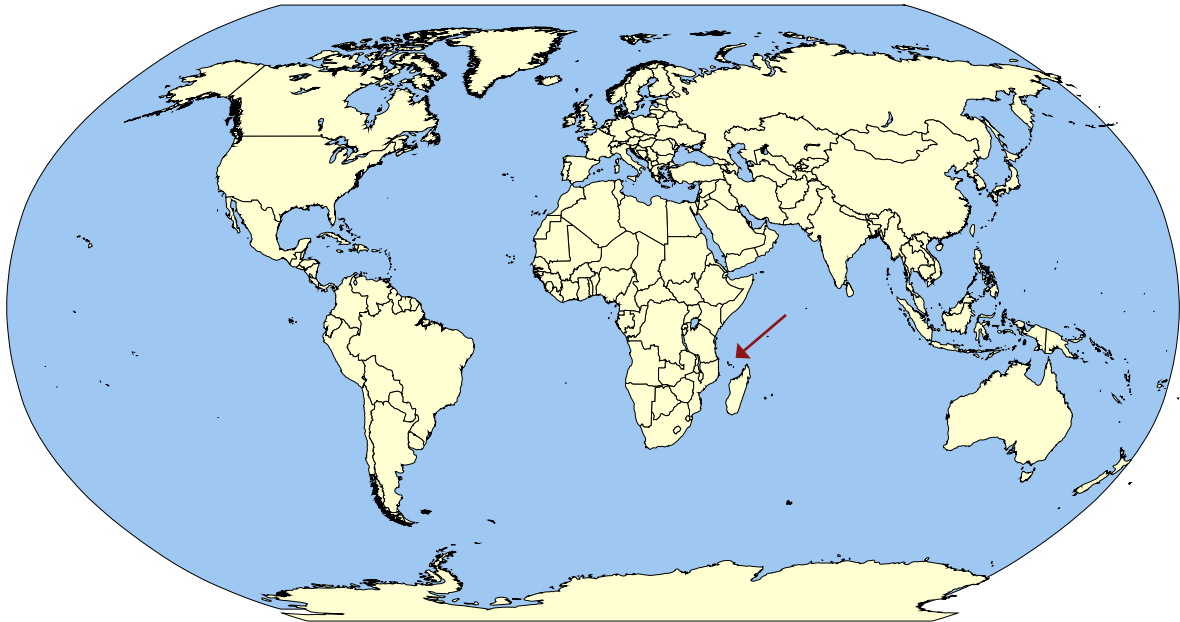

Schistosomiasis in Comoros

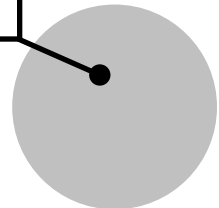
There is no indication that schistosomiasis has ever been present at a significant level in the island nation of Comoros due to a lack of suitable intermediate snail host species [1-3].
